

Austin Amateur Golf (AAG) is pleased to announce that Grady Bruce will Captain the 2017 Rudy's I-35 Cup Austin team as they play San Antonio on October 21-22<sup>nd</sup> at Comanche Trace Golf Club in Kerrville Texas.

Grady Bruce was born March 9, 1967, and was raised in Dallas, Texas. He began playing golf at age 12 and was 3-time TAPS Individual State Champion as well as winner of the Dallas City Junior Golf Championship while in high school. Grady lettered as a scholarship player at Abilene Christian University (ACU) and was awarded the GTE Golf Coaches and Wilson Golf Coaches Academic All-American award in 1989. Golf then had to take a back seat to medical school and residency from 1989-1999, but he began tournament golf again after moving to Austin, Texas, and becoming partner in his medical practice.



Since 2003, Grady has played in nine State Amateur Championships, ten State Mid-Amateur Championships including a third place finish in the TGA Mid-Am in 2008. In addition, he has been medalist multiple times for various qualifying events for the TGA and competed in the 2008 TGA Shoot-Out. He was second-place finish in the TGA Four-Ball Tournament with partner Trey O'Connell in 2007; 5-time Club Champion at Cimarron Hills Country Club; winner of the 2009 Memorial Day Four-Ball Tournament with partner Chris Hartenstein and 7-time member of the Hannon Cup Amateur Team including a successful win as captain of the Amateur Team in 2009. Grady is a 3-time member of the Austin I-35/Rudy's Cup Team. His overall career low score is 61 and low tournament score is 65. Grady and his wife Amy have been married 24 years and have lived in Austin for the past 18 years.
